The annual System Dynamics conference brings together people from around the world to share important research and application results and to build the community of those active within the field. For 2014 we return to the Netherlands, this time to Delft University of Technology.

The conference theme is *Good Governance in a Complex World*. We aim to address the role of models in governance in the public and private sectors, involving a diversity of domains, disciplines, organizations, stakeholders, policies, and goals.

We welcome all research and documented applications of methodology to solve real world problems, including innovative developments in techniques and tools aimed at creating new solutions.

The conference program will consist of invited and contributed sessions and workshops. There will be plenary presentations showcasing

important work in the field, along with parallel and poster sessions, making available the most current research, applications, and work in progress. In addition, there will be interest group sessions, student colloquia, the Modeling Assistance Workshop, vendor displays, demonstrations, skill-building workshops on Thursday and Friday, and more. The conference schedule will provide time for social and professional interaction.

A business event will be organized on Wednesday, July 23, for those from industry or public organizations who would like to become familiar with the possibilities of system dynamics for their organization. This *Business Day* includes admission to the System Dynamics conference on Wednesday, lunch, and special sessions for participants. Exhibitor demonstrations and software users' group meetings will showcase products and services in practice.

The 15th annual **PhD Student Colloquium** is scheduled for Sunday, July 20. This is an opportunity for PhD students to present and share their research through plenary and poster sessions. 
