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Part I: Narrative Summary

From the Executive Director

The *System Dynamics Society* is an international, nonprofit organization devoted to encouraging the development and use of system dynamics and systems thinking around the world. With members in 73 countries, the Society provides a forum in which researchers, educators, consultants, and practitioners in the corporate and public sectors interact to introduce newcomers to the field, keep abreast of current developments, and build on each other's work.

2013 was a very productive year. At the Home Office, we worked diligently to provide service to all of our members, plan and administer the conference in Cambridge, Massachusetts, USA, provide prompt delivery of our products, and maintain and improve our web presence.

I would like to thank staff members Erin Sheehan, Robin Langer and Kara James. Kara joined our staff in September to aid in Robin's transition to reduced (half time) hours. With additional support from Weijia Ran, a graduate student at the University at Albany, volunteers, and outside contractors, Joan Yanni and LouAnne Lundgren, operation run smoothly. The Home Office operations fall into five categories: Conference, Core, Publications, Sales, and Web Presence.




Conference

Conference management is a major part of Home Office operations for the first seven months of the year. At any one time, work is being done on the past year's conference, the current conference, and planning for future conferences. Time spent on conference management is always a substantial percentage of full year time allocation. Outsourcing is necessary and is a successful way to keep abreast of all the duties. Efforts to improve conference operations are ongoing as always.

Our conference location policy has two default locations, one in North America and one in Europe. The North American default site is Cambridge, Massachusetts, USA and the European site is Delft University of Technology, Delft, Netherlands. Locations outside these will be considered, on a case by case basis.

The Web Portal continues to be improved by Bob Eberlein, with the assistance of Weijia Ran. The Web Portal not only manages the submissions and program but assists with overall conference management. Many improvements and custom features are made each year improving functionality and reporting. Conference sponsorship contacts and details continue to be managed in Microsoft Access.

Future planning is actively ongoing for the Cambridge, Massachusetts, USA (2015) Conference to be held from July 19 to July 23, 2015. See the preliminary *Call for Papers* with your conference materials.



B-Conference Management

Core

Membership constitutes the primary core activity of the Society. In 2013, our membership totaled 1,159, our highest membership number ever. The Home Office goal is to provide accurate, prompt and personal service to all members and prospective members.

We include a membership option on the conference registration form. For the Cambridge conference, we processed 82 memberships. Please see Attachment I – Conference, A-Conference Attendance Statistics, *Conference Registration Fee Structure*, 2004-2013 (table 3), page 10.

After the annual conference, a personal invitation for membership is sent to non-member conference attendees. In addition, our renewal campaign includes monthly communications to members who did not renew.

Electronic-only delivery of the *System Dynamics Review* was chosen by 39.34% of members in 2013, a slight increase from the previous year.

Publications

Publication of the System Dynamics Society newsletters, the Bibliography, and support to the editors in the publication of, as well as, support to the members in the access of the *System Dynamics Review* are other Home Office duties.

The *System Dynamics Review* is published by Wiley-Blackwell four times a year. We are in year four of our eight year contract. The Society continues to build on the existing, successful partnership we have with Wiley-Blackwell.

There are usually three to four **newsletters** produced each year by Home Office staff. The March and October newsletters feature a message from the president of the Society and other Society news. In June there is a Special Issue on Sponsor News (for both Society and Conference sponsors). Conference reports are the highlight of the October newsletter. For print versions, we have fully transitioned to InDesign software which gives the newsletters a more professional appearance and enables us to more easily collaborate with our printer.

The System Dynamics **Bibliography** is maintained by an in-office bibliographer with scheduled published updates and is downloadable from our website. The Bibliography has been updated to include the *Proceedings* of the 31st International Conference of the System Dynamics Society and the System Dynamics Review Volume 29, Number 1-4. New entries and corrections are continuously being made, as the Bibliography is always a work in progress. This year we added a **Bibliographic Updates Page** which lists new additions to the Bibliography that are submitted between updates to the full Bibliography.



Sales

The Beer Distribution Game, Conference Proceedings, Journal, Bibliography, PhD Seminar Series and MIT Literature Collection can all be purchased from the Society.

There was a decrease in sales of the Production Distribution Game (Beer Game) in 2013; the Society sold 379 boards in 2013 after selling 396 in 2012. The all-time record for sales was 1,107 games sold in 2004.

In accordance with the 2011 contract with Wiley, past issues of the *Review* are available for sale to members of the Society. Although we continue to stock copies of back issues of the *System Dynamics Review*, access to past journals through our publisher using the Wiley Online Library website has influenced the sales. The last of the complete sets of back issues were sold during a special sale in 2010.

In 2013, the \$27,170 net income from the sales "cost center" helped support all operations offered by the Society office. The number is down slightly from 2012.

Web Presence

Immediately before the 2012 conference in St. Gallen we rolled out the new content management format for our main Society site. During 2013 we continued to convert the existing pages to Word Press, refining menu categories and checking links to complete the transition. We continue to offer sponsors website header space.

The Society website has been hosted by CirtexHosting since December 2010. To keep abreast of technological advancements, development funding must continue to be placed in the budget for web presence. We remain diligent regarding computer hygiene issues.

Our website includes an online discussion forum, a Facebook page as well as a Twitter feed. The discussion forum has multiple public and private discussion forums and topics. The Facebook page as well as the Twitter feed, has gained popularity and is used to share news and repost information from other sources.

We continue to model our permanent conference pages after the redesign of 2012:

Cross Category Issues

Sponsorship

In 2013 we began tracking Society Sponsorship using the Access database as we did in 2012 for Conference sponsor tracking.

Of the 35 Society sponsors that sent a gift or traded services, there were two new sponsors in 2013. Our sponsors are very committed, 28 of our 2013 Society sponsors have been sponsors for three consecutive years or more.

The Society office performs a systematic Society sponsorship program contacting all past Society sponsors and conference sponsors, inviting them to continue their support. In addition, we identify and email messages to repeat customers, to organizations with numerous members and to other consulting firms owned by members. This mailing is not only to solicit, but also to cultivate a relationship, to involve our members and others in the field of system dynamics.

With Society sponsorship, a sponsor receives up to three personal memberships and can purchase additional memberships at a discount. A total of 89 new or renewed members joined the Society for the calendar year 2013 as a result of the Society Sponsorship incentive.

Governance

A revised version of the Society Bylaws was passed in 2012 and became effective on January 1, 2013.


In 2011, under the advisement of our CPA, we began developing a set of guidelines to address items on the new, longer IRS Form 990. These guidelines deal with records retention and destruction as well as conflict of interest issues and are consistent with the operation of the Society as a not for profit organization. They are reviewed annually.

The Organization and Bylaws Committee revised the Policies and the document was posted for review. The revised Policies were approved at the 2013 Winter Policy Council meeting.

Finances

As stated earlier above, the Society is managed around five cost centers: conference, core operations, publications, sales and web presence. Please refer to the VP Finance report for full details. All bookkeeping files are maintained in QuickBooks. Since 2011, the Society continues to work with CPA, Tom Hosey of Lubbe & Hosey, PC.

An overall investment policy for the Society was implemented in 2005 and continues to be maintained. As per our investment consultant suggestion, rebalancing is done annually to achieve the original weighting in the overall investment policy. The investment plan for the Dana Meadows Fund, student prize restricted accounts is being maintained.

Conference Tasks: Responsibilities for conference activities have included, but are not limited to:

- Monitor the memorandum of understanding (MoU) if appropriate
- Maintain office and site finances in QuickBooks and Excel
- Manage registrations
- Organize and schedule meetings and events, including assignment of chairs
- Use Web Portal to:
 - o manage all aspects of submissions and review
 - o manage the tentative and final program
 - o schedule session chairs, room assignments and AV equipment arrangements
- Produce the printed abstract proceedings and web proceedings
- Support award committees, manage as needed: submissions, ceremonies, scheduling and handouts to recipients for Dana Meadows Student Prize Award, Jay W. Forrester Awards, Applications Award, Outstanding Service Award, Lifetime Achievement Award; and assist with outside awards.
- Event Insurance Coverage
- Design overall conference sponsor information (benefits, web page, etc.)
- Organize outsourcing for specialty work
- Organize the Poster Symposium
- Assist with all social program items including transportation
- Maintain the conference website
- Negotiate and work directly with the conference venue
- Work with Program Chair as needed
- Work with local host as needed
- Assist in implementing any new program features
- Organize all pre-conference and during-conference outside contractor and volunteer labor
- Assist participants with: any attendance issues, including funding transfer issues and letters of invitation for visas; roommate contacts; finding appropriate lodging; and manage other unique site-specific challenges.

Membership Distribution by Sector, 2004 – 2013


