Dear SDS Policy Council Colleagues and Friends,

I am pleased to forward two documents, responding to Roberta's request for an update on what we are now identifying as the 2ND ASIA PACIFIC REGION SYSTEM DYNAMICS CONFERENCE. I apologize for the lateness of this submission.

I was informed that brevity is the soul of virtue when it comes to such documents. Our "SUMMARY PROPOSAL/REPORT..." meets this criterion. My highly efficient and patient colleague, Ms. Yong Bee Choon, who is overall responsible for conference administration, prepared it. You may note a discrepancy between the dates given in the SDS Newsletter announcement – Feb. 20-23 – and those listed in the Summary Proposal/Report – Feb. 19-22. I regret the discrepancy, for which I am responsible. The dates listed in Bee Choon's summary proposal are the correct ones.

The, "Planning Notes" document, which I have been framing to think through the conference process in greater detail, violates the "brevity" criterion. It builds mostly upon planning documents that Roberta has kindly provided. I have taken the liberty of sharing it in the hope that some members may have time to look through it and share thoughts, though perhaps not in the Policy Council Meeting's time frame. I do so because, while Len and Nacho are experienced SD Society conference organizers, I am not. Thus, I will greatly welcome your suggestions. If they will include offers for help with conference organizing and program planning, so much the better.

Permit me to share a personal reflection since many of you are colleagues and friends of long standing. Your support will be particularly welcome because the primary mission of our "Residential College 4" (RC4) is not research – nor holding international conferences – but teaching, mentoring and administering a population of first and second-year undergraduates that will grow, over the summer, from our present population of about 350 students to more than 700. Hopefully, we will also add three or four new faculty members. Residential College 4 is an academic "start up" with all of the opportunities and challenges that term entails.

On the other hand, it is because of our undergraduate, graduate and even secondary school students, especially in RC4, but also in the Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy, Industrial and Systems Engineering, the Duke NUS Medical School, the Temasek Defense Systems Institute and the NUS High School of Mathematics and Science, that I view the opportunity this conference offers as exceptional. It will be an opportunity for some of Singapore's – and Asia's –future leaders to experience our field at a level than extends well beyond that which we can offer in our classes.

It is for this reason that I am so deeply grateful for the support of the Society in this endeavour and especially for Len and Nacho's partnership. To the degree that your other commitments and priorities permit, I will be grateful for your support and partnership as well. Moreover I hope that all of you will be able to join with us in Singapore, in February 2017.
