Budget Status


- Straw budget draft by Finance Committee / ED

China Chapter Membership Proposal

- * Reduce the membership fee to \$50
- * One payment for 3 years

Main Justifications:

- There are not many active members in China, the lower membership fee will help to attract new members while a higher membership fee will lead some to choose other associations. We need more members to promote SD in China;
- Based on the population and the current number of members, increasing the number is easier and may have an even higher total 'income';
- Most of the activities/ benefits provided by the SD society are not available for
 Chinese members, or very hard to access, because of the network access control, e.g.
 we use different social media, we cannot get the information from Facebook, and so on;
- There are many examples that China belongs to a different group from the U.S, normally the fee for Chinese members is lower, or the fee is based on individual income, in general, Chinese researchers will pay less (see next slide).

Main Website

- Main site moved from MemberClicks to Wordpress hosted on AWS
- Pluses
 - · Improved aesthetics
 - · Better integration with ecommerce and quickbooks
 - · Somewhat more approachable editing
- Neutrals
 - Still hit and miss organizationally
 - Managing user data is still cumbersome
- Minuses
 - · Some data lost in transition
 - · Overburdening Wordpress with information we want to keep
 - Didn't organize the data migration as well as we could have
 - Relatively slow page loads
 - · Large number of plugins



Infrastructure

 - Good flexibility around DNS and other capabilities
- Running 4 servers currently

 - Staging, webportal, proceedings, collections

 - Tiny

Webportal, Proceedings, Collections

- Continued maintenance
 - Integrated with wordpress for some membership info
 - Additional info is stored only for the web portal
 - · Using the wordpress database
 - Membership information not currently used
 - Conference registrations mostly connected
- Conference submissions and reviews
- Policy council reports and voting
- Proceedings and collections are purely static sites



Email, Social Media and Outreach

- Using google as our primary email host
 - Everything@systemdynamics.org
- Mailchimp for mass email
 - Much more frequent than in the past
- Still using Radiant Web Marketing
- Office (especially Fernando) taking on more work
- Volunteers for more specialized outlets
- Get some free Google ads we are trying to use
- Getting decent, but not amazing traction.



Going Forward

- Conference will be supported for hybrid next year
 - Conference site largely unchanged
- Need to clean up our database to remove duplicates and consolidate duplicated information
 - Ongoing as time is available (extremely slow progress)
- Much of the e-presence role is being taken over by the Office
 - · Back to being a technical resource
 - May make sense not to renew this VP position
